

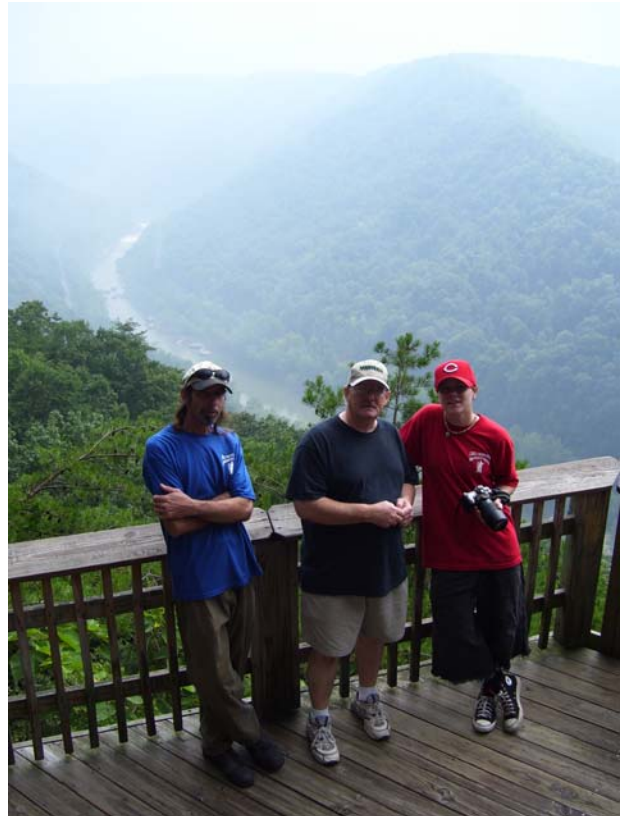
# HUNTINGTON SCHOOL OF FINE WOODWORK UPDATE

## Students Visit Tamarack and New River Gorge Bridge

## New Training Cycle Begins



In August, Josh Dygert was hired as the new woodshop instructor. Josh has a degree in architecture from the University of Tennessee with emphasis on furniture design. After graduating, Josh served as a graduate assistant at the university for several years instructing senior architect students in furniture design and construction.

In August, The Governor's Workforce Investment Division awarded the Huntington School of Fine Woodwork a grant in the amount of \$99,000 to fund two training programs over the next twelve months. The first component will be to train 22 students in beginning woodshop. The second component will be to train 5 students in advanced woodshop techniques.
